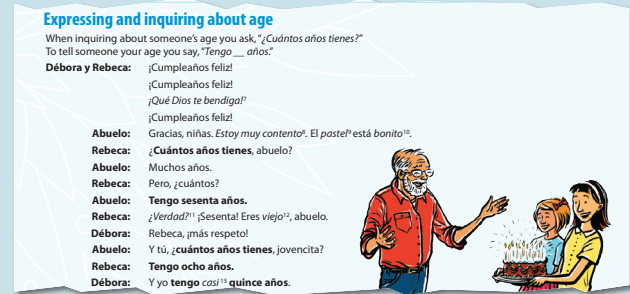

The Student Text and Teacher's Edition reflect the best practices in the field of second language acquisition and align with the ACTFL World-Readiness Standards for Learning Languages.



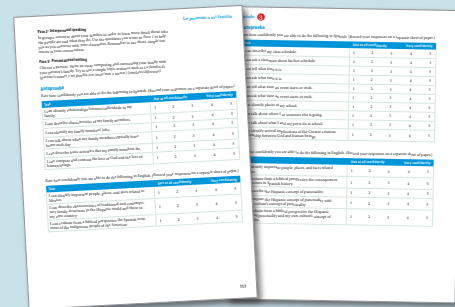
Communication and Comprehension

Lessons promote the development of long-term communication and comprehension skills by driving students to determine meaning through contextualized language study with an appropriate emphasis on form and structure rather than explicitly presenting grammar rules for memorization.



Three Modes of Communication

Throughout the text, students develop proficiency-building skills in all three modes of communication (interpretive, interpersonal, and presentational).



Integrated Performance Assessments

Chapters end with a suggested performance-based assessment that provides real-world scenarios for using the language. Each exam also includes an integrated performance assessment that can be used to assess student ability to use the language in spontaneous communicative exchanges.

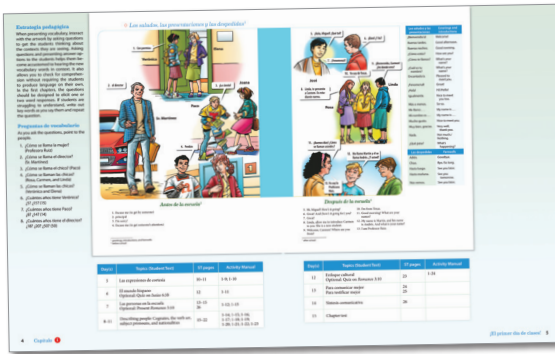

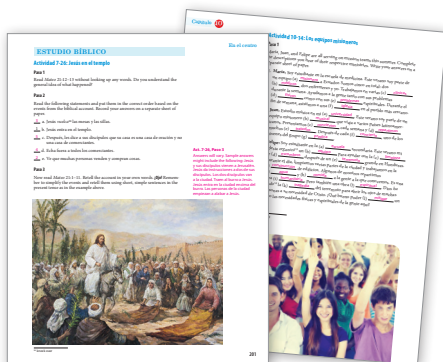


Student Text and Teacher's Edition

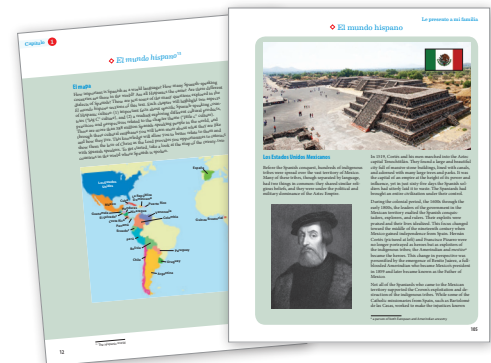
Cultural Studies

Each chapter includes two features that expand student familiarity with Spanish-speaking countries. These articles focus on the key principles that characterize those countries and the cultural practices within each country. Students are invited to discuss these principles and practices from a biblical worldview.



Sharing the Gospel

A primary goal for this course is helping students learn to present the gospel in a level-appropriate way. The "Para testificar mejor" feature at the end of each chapter helps students apply the communicative concepts to talking about the gospel. Students begin by comparing and contrasting the character and attributes of God and the character and attributes of human beings and work toward being able to share the gospel as presented in the book of Romans.



Audio Now in Both Student Text and Activity Manual

Students interact with spoken Spanish in both the Student Text and the Activity Manual through native-speaker recordings of conversations, descriptions, and pronunciation.
